Vaughn wrote award-winning 'Love on the Misty Isles'

The rugged beauty of Canada's Haida Gwaii islands forms the backdrop for three intertwining love stories in Rosemary Vaughn's "Love on the Misty Isles." The book is Vaughn's award-winning debut novel, known to readers as a page-turner with countless twists and turns.

"Love on the Misty Isles" took first place in the romance category in the Mill City Press 2017 Author Awards. Her debut novel recently placed as a 2018 Next Generation Indie Book Awards Finalist in two categories: Regional and Romance.

"Love on the Misty Isles" focuses on three women of different ages and backgrounds: Libby Campbell, Dr. Shirlee and Willow Shaw. Libby is a teacher who has moved to Haida Gwaii to escape the pain of lost love. Dr. Shirlee owns the coffeeshop where the community connects and interacts, but she's about to come face to face with her past. Willow, a member of the local Haida First Nations tribe, has sworn off love all together. As each confronts life, death, loyalty and forgiveness, the three women become close.

"Love on the Misty Isles" is a story about how people can come together as one despite their drastic differences and diverse backgrounds. It's also, of course, a story about love- not just romantic love, but the familial love that develops between friendships solidified in a small community.

Author Vaughn was born and raised in Canada, and lived for two years on Haida Gwaii before eventually moving to the United States. Vaughn got to know the islands during her time on Haida Gwaii, and her experience is reflected in her book's complexity and sense of authenticity.

Vaughn, who has valued creativity in all forms, has a love not only for writing, but also for the performing and visual arts. In her career, Vaughn brought her creative talents to the preparation of high school teachers as a professor at the University of North Dakota for several years.

Today, Vaughn spends her summers amongst the pines of Minnesota and her winters in palm-studded Florida, gaining her the title of the Pine to Palm Writer.
